We offer two specialised programmes for young musicians at different stages of their development, in partnership with Herfordshire Music. Additionally, we provide financial support for their music-related expenses.

Discovering Talent - for young musicians in the early stages of their musical development who demonstrate great potential.

Award: £500 per year Ages: approx. 8-13

Level: Grades 1-5 (or equivalent)

Nurturing talent - for musicians who show great musical potential and are passionate about developing their skills and confidence further.

Award: £1,000 per year

Ages: approx. 13-18

Level: Grades 6+ (or equivalent)

- Junior applicants will be selected from written applications alone.
- Development applicants will be shortlisted for a live audition in July 2024.

Eligibility

Our programmes are for young musicians who:

- Are under 18 years of age as of 1 September 2024.
- Have been permanently residing in the UK for a minimum of 3 years.
- Have a household income totalling no more than £35,000 per annum*.






Equity & inclusion at Future Talent:
